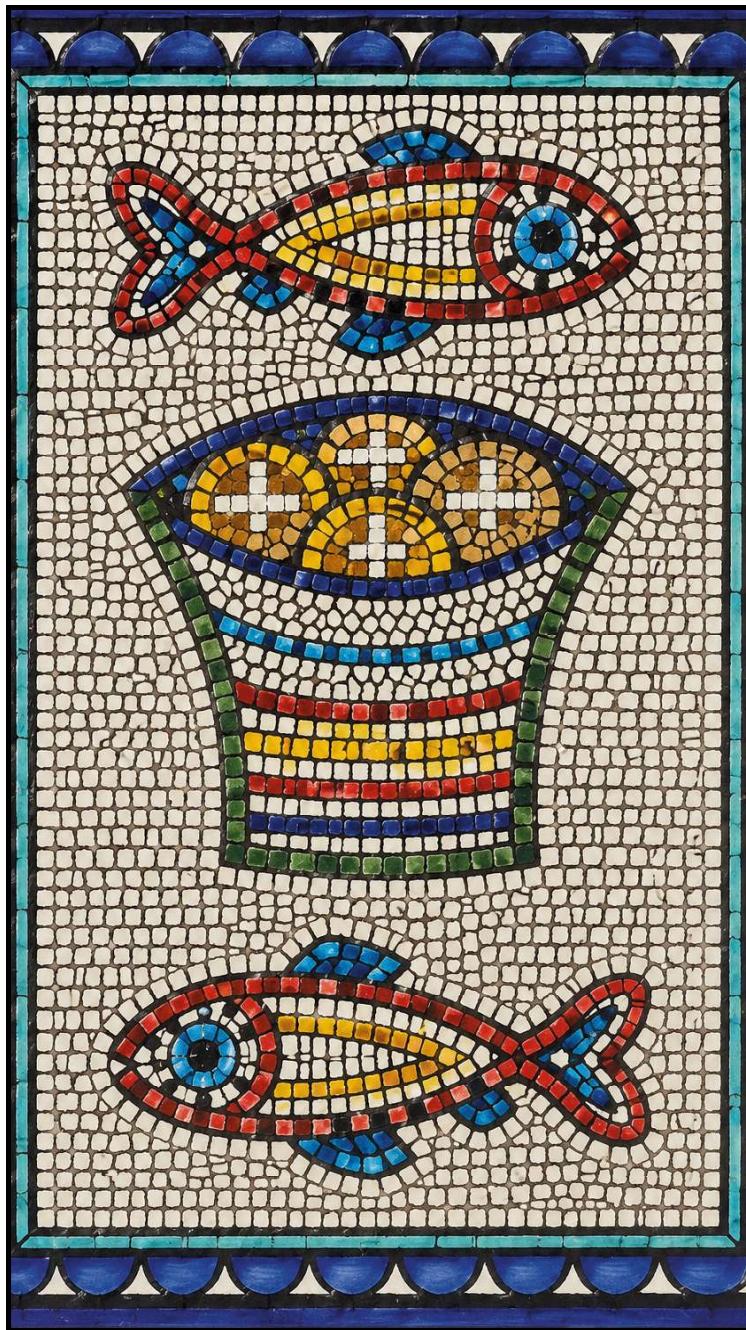

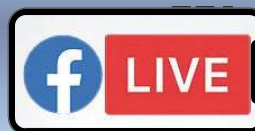

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings give us words of great love and comfort. As we listen, we may find ourselves breathing easier, feeling comforted. In Isaiah, God speaks to the people saying, "Come to me, listen, that you may have life." St. Paul tells us that nothing, not hardship or sorrow or difficulty "can separate us from the love of God poured out in Christ Jesus." Then we hear the gospel story of the miracle of the loaves and fish. Jesus having compassion for the crowd that had been with him, listening to him. This gospel draws a parallel to our Sunday Eucharist. We are nourished by the word of God, and we are fed the Body of Christ. In both - we are nourished for the days ahead. Catholic Questions — Answered —

Why do Catholics go to Mass every Sunday?

Sunday is not simply a day of obligation; it is the Lord's Day, the weekly celebration of Christ's Resurrection. From the earliest days of the Church, Christians gathered on the first day of the week to listen to God's Word, celebrate the Eucharist, and strengthen one another in faith (Acts 20:7). By participating in Mass, we unite ourselves to Christ's perfect sacrifice on the Cross, made sacramentally present in every Eucharistic celebration.

The Sunday Mass is the source and summit of the Christian life because it nourishes us with God's Word and the Body and Blood of Christ. It is where we give thanks to God, receive His grace, and are sent forth to live the Gospel in our homes, workplaces, and communities. Missing Mass without a serious reason weakens our relationship with God because it means neglecting the greatest gift Christ left His Church.

The Church obliges Catholics to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days not as a burden but as a loving invitation to remain close to Christ. Just as families gather regularly around the table, God's family gathers around the altar. Every Sunday is a "little Easter," reminding us that Jesus is alive and continues to feed His people with His Word and His Eucharist.

Preguntas Católicas Respondidas

¿Por qué los católicos van a Misa todos los domingos?

El domingo no es solamente un día de obligación; es el Día del Señor, la celebración semanal de la Resurrección de Jesucristo. Desde los primeros tiempos de la Iglesia, los cristianos se reunían el primer día de la semana para escuchar la Palabra de Dios, celebrar la Eucaristía y fortalecer su fe (Hch 20,7). Al participar en la Santa Misa nos unimos al sacrificio perfecto de Cristo en la Cruz, que se hace presente sacramentalmente en cada celebración eucarística.

La Misa dominical es la fuente y la cumbre de la vida cristiana porque alimenta nuestra fe con la Palabra de Dios y con el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor. Allí damos gracias a Dios, recibimos su gracia y somos enviados a vivir el Evangelio en nuestras familias, lugares de trabajo y comunidades. Faltar deliberadamente a la Misa sin una causa grave debilita nuestra amistad con Dios, porque significa rechazar el mayor regalo que Cristo dejó a su Iglesia.

La Iglesia nos pide participar en la Misa todos los domingos y fiestas de precepto no para imponernos una carga, sino para ayudarnos a permanecer unidos a Cristo. Así como una familia se reúne alrededor de la mesa, la familia de Dios se reúne alrededor del altar. Cada domingo es una pequeña Pascua que proclama que Cristo vive y sigue alimentando a su pueblo.

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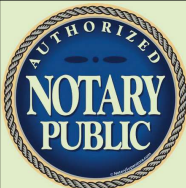
